SCHOOL UNIFORM

In line with our school uniform

policy, pupils may choose to

wear either winter or summer

uniform between Easter and

October half term break.

Tops include white polo shirts or

shirts/blouses in red gingham.

The red gingham may also be

worn as skirts or shorts with a

white blouse or polo shirt, also in

a 'playsuit style'. Please ensure

that younger children are

confident in undoing styles of

clothing for PE and toileting.

Closed school shoes must be

worn. We do not allow open toe

sandals for safety reasons.

CHILDHOOD ILLNESSES

We currently have outbreaks of chicken pox, 'Slapped Cheek' (parvovirus) and Scarlet Fever in school. If children show any symptoms, please check with your GP before sending them to school and inform the school office so that we can keep a record of any significant numbers of cases. There has been a recent national increase in the notifications of Scarlet Fever. Guidance is available for all childhood illnesses on the Public Health England website and children and adults affected can return to school or work if they feel well enough after 24 hours once they have been given antibiotics. Symptoms include: a rash which feels like sandpaper-usually on the torso, flushed cheeks, temperature, sore throat, headache, nausea and sometimes a 'strawberry tongue'.

A TRIP TO THE BALLET

If anyone fancies a special treat in April then look no further than The London Children's Ballet, which is performing the Oscar Wilde story of The Canterville Ghost from the 19th-22nd April at the Peacock Theatre in London.
